Eligible Recipients of Payments	 Non-federal, non-industrial forest landowners, including: Individuals, groups, associations, corporations, or other private legal entities; Federally and state recognized Tribes, as well as equivalent governmental representatives of native indigenous communities; and Units of local government. Eligible Lands	 Non-industrial private forest land; Forest land owned by a unit of local government; and Forest land held in trust for Native Hawaiians by the Department of Hawaiian Homelands and the Office of Hawaiian Affairs. 	Private forest land.
	 For both opportunities: Land must be rural, forested (or suitable for growing trees), and owned by an eligible recipient of payments. Tribal land held in trust by the federal government on behalf of Tribes and individual Tribal members is considered eligible.
